## ADG #7 REPORTS:

### 1.) <u>Mayor</u>

#### 2.) City Manager

Mr. Scudder said he found out about a bill that went through the Federal level. It was called the American Water Infrastructure Act - 2018 water study. Certain size jurisdictions must do a water study, so he has been talking to Tom, Hunter, and Corey Henson about the study. The study must be completed by sometime in 2022. Mr. Scudder said the study will cost between \$8,000.00 to \$12,000.00. He said we have been getting some pretty good census data.

Councilman Cooper wanted to know what the water study is studying. Mr. Scudder said it will be studying the water usage, the infrastructure, how you safeguard the availability of your water. Councilman Cooper wanted to know if the study was an environmental quality study.

Mr. Scudder then said that all 3 jurisdictions went together and got a State grant for the census: each jurisdiction got \$2,500.00. Kristina Ramsey has been heading this up for Buena Vista. She did a really good job putting the grant request together. We are going to do advertisements in the Advocate and the Gazette. We are also going to do some fliers, a banner, and some posters. The people that are listening this evening really need to spread the word. We need to get a really good count because it benefits roads and schools and all kinds of social related issues.

#### 3.) City Attorney

### 4.) Council Committee/Representative

Councilman Henson wanted to know if the water study would include some of the old infrastructure.

Mr. Scudder said it does include some of the old infrastructure. He said they have been talking to Hunter Young about it. He knows about as much about the City's water system as anyone.

Vice-Mayor Clark said that at one time Hunter was working on getting a map on where all the water lines are.

Mr. Scudder said that is the I & I study for water going into our sewage plant. We have done the mapping. There are some remaining pieces to be done for that. We have that project on hold due to our budget issues. He opined we will probably complete the study within the next 6 months. Mr. Scudder said he is trying to get a grant to pay for the remaining portion of the study. He said we have also been doing some water modeling. There are 3 studies we are working on right now. We have Joe Howard from AMT back on the scene for paving. They are going to be putting the timeline together for the paving project for Route 60 and Route 501.

Councilman Henson wanted to know if the cemetery is ready for Mother's Day this weekend.

Mr. Scudder said the cemetery looks good.

## NB #2 FIRST READING OF AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE TAX RATES FOR THE CITY OF BUENA VISTA FY2021:

Ms. Wheeler read the following Ordinance:

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE TAX RATES FOR THE CITY OF BUENA VISTA, VIRGINIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2021

#### <u>ORDINANCE</u>

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF BUENA VISTA, VIRGINIA**, that in accordance with Section 26-1 of the Code of the City of Buena Vista, there is hereby levied upon taxable real estate an effective tax rate of One Dollar and Thirty-Three Cents (\$1.33) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation for the fiscal year 2021, said levy to be based upon the value of such property as of July 1, 2020.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that there is hereby levied upon Personal Property a tax rate of Five Dollars and Eighty-Five Cents (\$5.85) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation for the calendar year 2021, said levy to be based upon the value of such property as of January 1, 2020.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that there is hereby levied upon all public service corporation real estate the sum of One Dollar and Thirty-Three Cents (\$1.33) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation for the fiscal year 2021, said levy to be based upon the value of such property as of January 1, 2020.

**BE IT STILL ORDAINED,** that the Refuse fee shall be Twenty-One Dollars and zero cents (\$21.00) per month residential and shall be Eight Dollars and Forty cents (\$8.40) per unit commercial.

**BE IT STILL FURTHER ORDAINED**, that all other tax rates not expressly defined above shall remain the same until further action by council.
